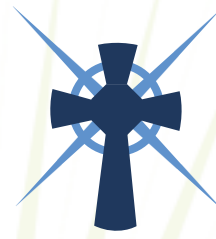

Making Prevention The Goal



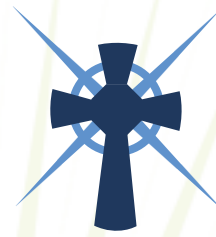

SAFETY TIP

We think of mold as something creeping and insidious, but if you suspect you might have a mold problem it is vital to act swiftly and aggressively!

The first thing you should do is contact Catholic Mutual's Claims Department as soon as possible. We will talk you through the next steps, but one thing we will ask is that you make a visual inspection of the mold contamination to determine the extent of mold growth and scope of work necessary for remediation. We may also recommend that you consult with an Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) professional to test the site.

By keeping us informed of any potential mold issues you encounter, you are giving us the tools we need to help you mitigate the damage mold can cause.

Sump Things You Should Know

Sump pumps play an essential role in keeping many basements and crawl spaces dry, but many people don't realize that there is some maintenance required to keep them operating and in good working order. If your pump ever fails to work, whether due to a malfunction, age, clogging or other circumstance, your basement could rapidly fill up with water. As with anything electric, sump pumps require extra caution at all times. A recent [tragedy](#) in Maryland highlighted this when a mother and her 4-year-old daughter were electrocuted outside their home while trying to remove water from their flooded stairwell. It is important to remember to hire a professional to deal with your sump pump, particularly if there is standing water in the basement.
